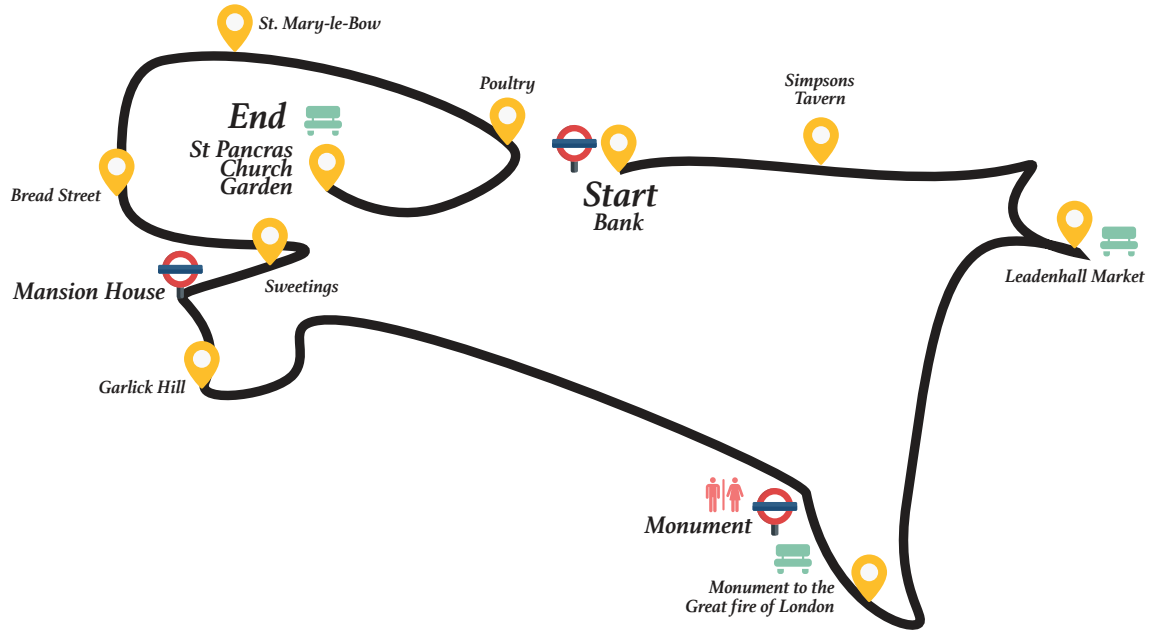


Let's walk!

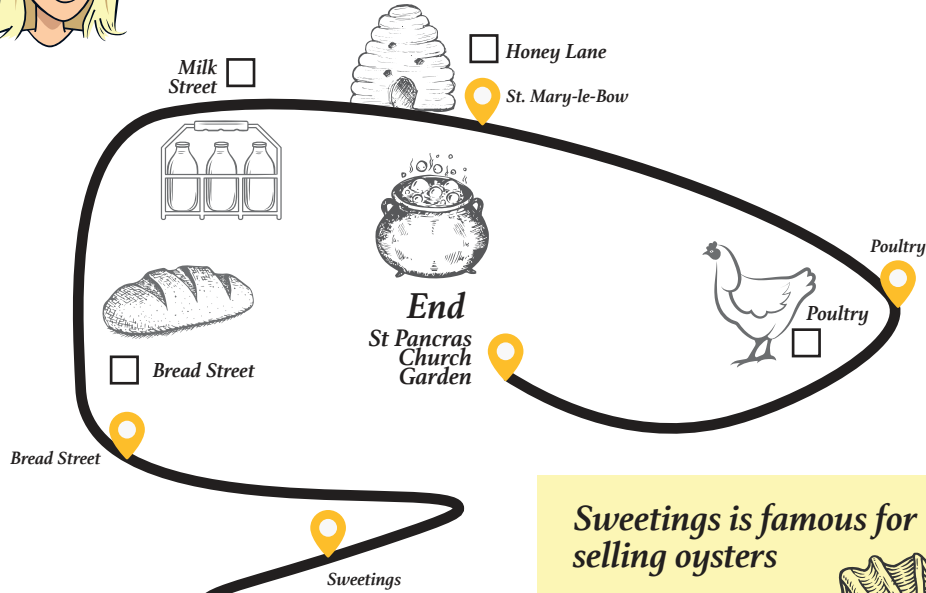

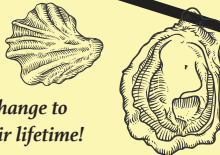

Top oyster facts

1. All oysters are born male, most change to female during their lifetime!
2. All oysters produce pearls, but not all pearls produced are beautiful or valuable. Pearls can also be harvested from freshwater mussels.
3. Oysters have colourless blood!
4. They can live up to 20 years and the biggest oyster discovered was 35.5 cm – that's a little bit larger than a school ruler
5. There are only 5 species of oyster in the world!

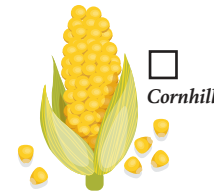


Simpsons is one of the oldest restaurants in the City, opening in 1757! They've served a dessert for over two centuries called Stewed Cheese. Do you think that sounds delicious or disgusting? The old recipe listed in the handwritten Cookbook of Unknown Ladies reads:
