
Ask a grown up to show you where fire alarms are in your house!

Clearing up when you spill water or juice will stop people slipping and getting injured, as will tidying away cables and wires. Like I always say – little steps stop big falls!



TRIP & FALL HAZARDS

Lots of things around your house could cause people to fall and hurt themselves – toys or clothes not being put away properly, a pool of water on the floor and untidy cables or wires for example.

PLANET PROTECTOR

There's lots we can do at home to help protect the environment and look after the planet! We can even help by saving water – not leaving the tap running when you brush your teeth can save 200 gallons of water a month!

RECYCLING

One of the best things you can do to help the environment at home is to recycle. Most places in the UK will let you recycle plastic, metal, cardboard, paper, glass, food and more.

ELECTRIC EXPERT

It's important not to play around with plugs and sockets, or to plug too many things into one socket. Also, remember – water and electricity don't mix!

ELECTRICITY AT HOME

Electricity powers most of our favourite things – toys, televisions, computers and more. But it's not something to be played with – used in the wrong way, electricity is very dangerous.

Never plug too many things in one socket it can cause a fire!



Tell an adult if a plug or socket is broken or wet.

KITCHEN KEEPER

I love the kitchen – it's where all the tasty food is! But there are also things in a kitchen that we need to be careful with. Hot or sharp things, like an oven or knives can be very dangerous if they're not used properly.

Some of the things that we use to clean our home can be dangerous if we don't know how to use them. Read these tips to stay safe in the kitchen!




