Start St Paul's Cathedral In this walk, we're going to be checking out some of the City's historic churches and the amazing art treasures that can be found in them.

Today, there are 42 historic churches within the City of London - all either Grade I or Grade II listed, and they show an incredible amount of architectural and artistic history - with art from famous artists such as Jacob Epstein, Patrick Heron, Damien Hirst, Henry Moore, John Skeaping and Bill Viola.
